# Accomplishments of the Board and its Committees

## *Many Thanks to All!*

The Walker Lakeshores Landowners Association Board of Directors and Officers and committees work behind the scenes for our community saving our property owners the cost of a communality manager and clubhouse manager.

### **Lake Committee by Peter Wulforth**

This was a good year for our lake, but we were provided with some challenges. The combination of abundant precipitation with the pipeline work upstream of Walker Lake created high levels of nutrients in the lake. This resulted in a small blue-green algae and growth of water shield and water lilies. The aquatic plants were treated by our lake consultant. Other water quality parameters including dissolved oxygen, nitrates and turbidity were within normal limits.

Other work by the lake committee included updating the Walker Lake Dam Emergency Action Plan, the stocking of Walker Lake with largemouth bass and bluegills in early summer, monitoring the Canada Geese population and monitoring the level of Walker Lake to prevent damage to lakefront property owners.

The Lake Committee joined the Road Committee and visited the roads to address the runoff from various roads.

In addition, I attended a program this past summer where there was information from the PA Fish & Boat Commission and US Coast Guard on safety considerations of boat and dock owners on lakes.

### **Social Committee by Fran Orth**

Last year we started off with our New Years Eve Bash in the clubhouse and we had a Super Bowl Party also at the clubhouse. There were several Casino bus trips that were a lot of fun especially our two casinos in one day on Valentine's Day which had a waiting list and could have filled another bus!

# Back

On October 28th, we collected the last water samples and ended the 2011 monitoring program at Walker Lake. This past season had many ups and downs due to the rainy spring, hot weather in July, and then the extensive rainfall that began in August and persisted through September.

The results of our monitoring reflect these changing conditions and gave us a good picture of what influences water quality in the lake. The water temperatures ranged from a low of 15.8°C in May at the outlet to a high of 28.4°C in July. The lake stratified in June at a depth of around 2.5 meters or 6.6 feet, which is earlier than what has been observed in previous years. Because the lake stratified portions of the lake deeper than 6.6 feet

were unable to support fish. Therefore a large portion of the lake basin was not able to provide habitat for fish, which often causes stress on the fish population.

The pH values remained neutral throughout most the monitoring period, with the highest values occurring in August. In August, the extensive rainfall caused an algal bloom that persisted through the fall. It is not uncommon for pH to increase in response to extensive algal blooms, but pH never reached a value that was considered harmful to the ecology of the lake. The water transparency (Secchi depth) was greatest in May with a Secchi depth of 2.25 meters or 7.4 feet.

Generally, water clarity decreases throughout the summer months when algae blooms are most likely to occur. This was the case this past season as we saw Secchi depth decrease throughout June and July to a low of 1.0 meters in August. Typically, we treat algal growth when the transparency is less than 1.5 meters, but because of the extensive rainfall the treatments were not performed.

Generally the nitrate nitrogen concentrations in Walker Lake remain low (< 1.0 ppm) throughout the monitoring season, while the total phosphate concentrations are higher than what is considered acceptable in natural waters (< 0.01 ppm). In September with all the rainfall, total phosphate concentrations were greater than 3.0 ppm. This indicates that runoff flowing into the lake is most-likely the source of nutrient loading in the lake.

In addition to monitoring water quality, plant and algal growth in the lake is monitored each month. No visible algae or submerged plant growth was observed in May. Watershield is the primary floating plant that appeared in early June along with patches of spatterdock that exist primarily in the southern end of the lake. A planktonic algae bloom occurred in late July and persisted through September. The heaviest algal growth occurred near the inlet, which corresponds to the high total phosphate concentrations we observed throughout this time period. The algae bloom reached its peak in August and September and caused the water clarity to drop to 1.0 meters (3.3 feet). Since these late season algal blooms are becoming more common in Walker Lake, future management of the lake may require use of a chemical algaecide (copper sulfate) to control the blooms.

In August, at the request of several property owners patches of watershield that were restricting access to docks were treated with a chemical herbicide. As always, we have enjoyed working with your Association this past season and look forward to our continued relationship in the future. We always appreciate your questions and comments. So please don't hesitate to let us know what you are thinking. It is your lake and we are challenged to make it the best lake in the Poconos. Stay warm this winter and we look forward to seeing you on the lake in the spring.
