Snow Contract

The Snow contract two-year renewal was signed by John Weber and Frenchmen Excavating, LLC

Gravel Roads

- Frenchmen Excavating is nearly the ½ way completion point of road repairs. The second payment of \$15,000 will be
 due at that point once their invoice and voucher are received. The final payment of \$20,000 upon completion of all
 gravel roads
- Frenchmen Excavating hauling in the 2a modified stone update. If Springbrook Quarry delivered the stone, the cost is \$21.75 per ton. Stone picked up from the quarry is \$14.10 per ton. Therefore, we will be paying the quarry directly for the stone and paying Frenchmen \$7.65 per ton delivery charge. It was agreed at the executive board meeting to allow Frenchmen to transport the stone to help expedite the process of receiving stone when necessary. In the end, it will be all the same cost and within or under budget approved for stone.

Asphalt Roads

• We do have a pothole on Maple Drive because someone filled it in with stone during the winter and the stone was still in the hole when the roads were patched, now with all the rain and cars running over it the stone is out.

Signs

- Working on preparing the list to seek bids for clearing trees and/or branches from blocking signs. Looking to seek bids by end of the month.
- Previously reported
 - Will be seeking bids after the leaves are on the trees to cut clear vegetation and tree limbs blocking street name signs as this can be a safety hazard in an emergency where first responders are needed.
 - We have several street signs that are down or damaged. These will have to be fixed. Will be making a list before next meeting.

Roadside Drainage

- Will inspect ditches for those that were sent notices.
- Need to send more notices out but very time consuming

Unimproved Roads Requests

- Nothing new on these
 - From the 8/20/22 report: The office received request for information on undeveloped road from Pike County Habitat for Humanity. Apparently, someone wants to donate some land to them on an undeveloped road.
 Information sent. This is on Piute.
 - o From the 8/20/22 report: We need to provide landowner on a portion of undeveloped Delaware about the requirements to improve the road in order for WLLA to assume maintenance.
